Taughannock District 2020 Spring Blue and Grey Camporee Patrol Flags

Each patrol will need 15 or so flags, since they'll surrender a flag if they lose at a station (and capture one if they win, of course). There will probably be ten stations in the morning and ten in the afternoon, but some of them will be non-competitive, so fifteen should be more than ample.


There's no size requirement. In the past, most of the patrols had flags around 8½x11", for no particular reason other than that it's the size of a sheet of paper - see below for an example. Remember that this time we're not having the patrols represent specific Civil War regiments, so your patrol would put a number and location something like "19th Slaterville" on their flags instead of the number and state of the regiment whose history the Scouts were given.

The patrol might want to decorate the flag with one of the Branch or Corps symbols or perhaps a silhouette of a soldier. See the back of this flyer for some of these graphics for them to look at.

Note that the patrol flags should not include any representation of any of the Confederate national or battle flags, or anything else which might cause offense or bad publicity in this hyper-sensitive time.
