



# Angus McBroon Assaulted, Injured Strange Tartan found on Site is Only Clue

Angus McBroon, Senechal to Sir Hugh Barton, Laird of Frontenac, was found cruelly injured yesterday by herders on the Frontenac Estate. The nature of his injuries is not yet known, but the Sisters believe he will recover. He is not yet conscious, and thus cannot aid in identifying his attackers. A small scrap of tartan of unknown design is the only clue found on the site, as rain has washed away any tracks that might have aided in finding the attacker or attackers.

## Registration to Open Shortly
