



What YOU need to know about Cub Scout Resident Weekend at Camp Barton

Cub Scout Resident Weekend will be held at Camp Barton on August 12-14, 2022. Check-in will begin at 9:00 AM on August 12th, and the closing will be at about 3:30 PM on August 14th. The cost is \$55 per person.

Meals will be served in the dining hall; sleeping accommodations will be in 2-person tents. Flush toilets and hot showers are available in a central location, while latrines are located adjacent to each campsite.

The staff is made up of Scouting volunteers, including members of the Camp Barton Staff Alumni Association and parents of attending Cub Scouts.

The camp is available to all current Cub Scouts except newly-joined Lion Cubs. As of the end of school, all current Lions are now Tiger Cubs and are eligible to attend. Current second-year or Arrow of Light Webelos Scouts should have already graduated into Scouting BSA Troops, and should attend camp with their Troops.

The theme of the camp is **Knights' Quest**, based on the history of the Barton family estate in the southern highlands of Scotland in the 1700's. Sir Hugh Barton's seneschal (chief of staff) has been attacked, and Sir Hugh has asked young people from his estates to assist in finding the attacker by gathering clues as they travel throughout the region.

The clues will eventually lead to determining the identity of the attacker, and Sir Hugh will knight all of his young retainers in reward for their services.
