

Adult Leader Training Requirements to be Considered “Trained”

Note – to receive credit for taking online courses:

Log in to my.scouting.org for all online courses. Click on the ‘person icon’ at the top right to edit your profile to include your email, to allow BSA to send you your completion certificates. Add your BSA ID in as well to have the training credited to you in the BSA’s computer system.

Youth Protection Training is for EVERY REGISTERED ADULT age 18 and above:

The Baden-Powell Council requires every registered person age 18 and above to take Youth Protection Training (YPT) every calendar year.

Hazardous Weather Training is for EVERY REGISTERED DIRECT CONTACT LEADER:
