Hawaii is known as the Aloha State. What is Aloha? The literal meaning of aloha is "the presence of breath" or "the breath of life." Materials needed for each patrol:

- Some sort of sled for snow (or perhaps grass or perhaps both?!), on which should be:
- Beach tools!
- Pocketknife for each Scout
- Ropes for up to 20 lashings if you have them
- Normal "essentials" for troop outings, including a first aid kit with plenty of band aids
- Paper, pen/pencil, ruler

Also required, but not necessarily carried on the sled: Cooking materials and food to cook a lunch including SPAM (see below)

Lunch:

The state of Hawaii is the biggest consumer of SPAM*; six million cans of the processed pork are consumed on the archipelago every single year – the equivalent of five cans for each person! Each patrol will (at registration) be given one can of SPAM for every 4 people in the patrol. They should make a lunch using the SPAM and present it to the judges in the dining hall by 12.45 pm. The dish will earn points for flavor, presentation, balanced nutrition and Hawaiian authenticity.

** Spam is a brand of canned cooked pork introduced by Hormel Foods Corporation in 1937 which gained popularity worldwide after its use during World War II. By 2003, Spam was sold in 41 countries on six continents and is trademarked in over 100 countries.*
